Scope

Energy efficiency is paramount for industry and a crucial tool in its strive for higher competitiveness under constant pressure of ever-rising energy prices. After the adoption of the new Energy Efficiency Directive, it remains high on the European agenda as well with the on-going reform of the Emissions Trading System (EU ETS).

In Belgium, energy efficiency in industry is driven by voluntary agreements between the main industrial concerns and the public authorities of the Flemish and Walloon Regions, who are aiming at a reduction of energy consumption by energy-intensive sectors in the foreseeable future.

The objective of the EUWP workshop is to give an overview of innovative and ambitious energy efficiency projects in all industrial sectors, but with a special focus on the energy and waste heat recovery technology and its achievements and running projects in the Belgian food & beverage sector.

The afternoon will offer the 4th seminar in the series of Implementing Agreement Days of Belgium, this edition being dedicated to energy end-use technology. Belgian experts will share the findings of their current work in the field of combustion technology, while visiting experts will illustrate the potential of energy storage applications to contribute waste heat management and CO₂-emissions reductions and present recent developments in heat pumping technologies.
